

**Searcy City Council – Regular Session**  
**Tuesday, May 14, 2019 6:00 p.m.**  
**Minutes**

A public hearing had been advertised to be held 6:00 p.m. regarding the private club permit application from Chili's-Searcy Club, Inc. for Chili's/Searcy restaurant. The public hearing was convened and it was explained by City Attorney Buck Gibson that due to a change in management, it has been requested to be continued until the regular June, 11 2019 City Council meeting. He further explained that this would be in line with the rules of order for the conduct of meetings, similar to tabling an agenda item. He stated that this would require a motion, second, and a roll call vote. A motion was made by Mr. Raney and seconded by Mr. Cargile to continue this public hearing until the regular June 11, 2019 City Council meeting. Motion carried with the following voting "yes": Cothern, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, Brewer, and Chalenburg. Mayor Osborne stated the public hearing is continued until the regular June 11, 2019 City Council meeting..

A public hearing had been advertised to be held immediately following the previous public hearing regarding the private club permit application from Central Arkansas Soccer Academy, Inc. for Whole Hog Café-Searcy, Arkansas restaurant. Mayor Osborne opened the public hearing. A total of 6 persons signed the sign-in sheet to speak. The attorney representing the Whole Hog Café – Searcy spoke first and then answered any questions from the Council. Four persons spoke afterward followed by the owner of the restaurant and then again the attorney representing the restaurant. Mayor Osborne thanked all who chose to speak after allowing all to do so. Mayor Osborne closed the public hearing.

A public hearing had been advertised to be held immediately following the previous public hearing regarding the private club permit application from McCain Dining Club for Truth Table restaurant. Mayor Osborne opened the public hearing. A total of 5 persons signed the sign-in sheet to speak. The attorney representing the Truth Table restaurant spoke first and then answered any questions from the Council. The owner of the restaurant then spoke to the Council. Four persons spoke afterward. A person who was not a resident of Searcy signed to speak. Mayor Osborne noted that the public hearing is open to residents of the city. Mr. Brewer made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Arnett, to suspend the rules and allow the non-resident to speak. Motion carried with a vote of seven "yes" and one "no". Voting "yes" were: Cothern, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, Brewer, and Chalenburg. Voting "no" was Raney. This person was allowed to speak, followed by the attorney representing the restaurant. Mayor Osborne thanked all who chose to speak after allowing them to do so. Mayor Osborne closed the public hearing.

Mayor Kyle Osborne called to order the Regular Session of the Searcy City Council. Randall Beaty gave the Invocation, with the Pledge of Allegiance following, led by Rodger Cargile. City Clerk/Treasurer Jerry Morris called the roll with the following Council members answering "present": Logan Cothern, Mary Ann Arnett, Chris Howell,

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Rodger Cargile, Dale English, Don Raney, Dale Brewer and Mike Chalenburg. Also present was City Attorney Buck Gibson.

Item (3) on the agenda was for a motion to suspend the rules and amend the agenda to add items: 8) discussion regarding the Park Avenue/Cloverdale drainage project, 22-1-r) budget ordinance appropriation for the acquisition of 40-yard dumpsters, 22-1-s) budget ordinance appropriation for a solid waste grant through the White River Planning and Development District, Inc., 22-1-t) budget ordinance appropriation for a solid waste grant through the White River Planning and Development District, Inc., 22-1-u) budget ordinance appropriation for the 2019 Parks and Tourism grant, 22-2-a) budget ordinance authorization to expend funds for additional amount for fuel for all departments, 22-2-k) budget ordinance authorization to expend funds for additional amount for construction services for the Park Avenue/Cloverdale drainage project, and 22-2-l) budget ordinance authorization to expend funds for the acquisition of 40-yard dumpsters. A motion was made by Mr. Raney and seconded by Mr. Brewer to suspend the rules and amend the agenda to add the items. Mayor Osborne asked if there was any discussion regarding the motion. Motion carried with the following voting “yes”: Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, Brewer, Chalenburg, and Cothorn.

The minutes of the regular April 9, 2019 meeting of the Council were presented for approval. A motion was made by Mr. Chalenburg and seconded by Mr. English to approve the minutes. The following voted to approve: Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, Brewer, Chalenburg, Cothorn, and Arnett.

Clerk/Treasurer Jerry Morris presented and read the Treasurer’s Report which lists the following balances as of 4-30-2019: General Fund: \$917,460.19; Street Fund \$1,477,134.58; Capital Equipment Fund \$17,752.97; LOPFI Fund \$213,213.92; Act 833 Fund \$17,766.78; Airport Fund \$31,748.91. The total of all of the preceding funds is \$2,675,077.35. He also reported the following balances as of 4-30-2019: Special Highway Connector Route Tax Fund \$4,015,703.78; 2014 Eight Year Plan Fund \$7,681,823.41; Information Technology Projects Fund \$19,371.69; Special Projects Fund \$2,564.46; 0.25% Fire Protection Services County Sales Tax Fund \$216,422.10. He also reported a total of \$2,105,701.19 year-to-date in City and County Sales Tax revenues received, which is down \$79,052.72 from the same time in 2018.

Item (6) on the agenda was for the appointment of Jean Waldrop to fill an open unexpired term on the Searcy Library Board, with the term set to expire on December 31, 2021. A motion was made by Mr. Chalenburg and seconded by Mr. Cothorn to appoint Jean Waldrop to an open unexpired term on the Searcy Library Board, with the term set to expire on December 31, 2021. Motion carried with the following voting “yes”: Cargile, English, Raney, Brewer, Chalenburg, Cothorn, Arnett, and Howell.

Item (7) was for the appointment of members of the Advertising and Tourism Promotion (A&P) Commission. The following persons, along with their terms, were recommended by Mayor Osborne for appointment to the A&P Commission:

- Mike Chalenburg: City Council member, one (1) year term

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- Chris Howell: City Council member, one (1) year term
- Brandon Williams: Citizen at large, two (2) year term
- Mica Boykin: Owner/Manager Tourism Industry (Hampton Inn), one (1) year term
- Brian Mayhall: Owner/Manager Tourism Industry (Colton's Steakhouse), two (2) year term
- Jim House: Owner/Manager Tourism Industry (The Landing), three (3) year term
- Brandon Fox: Owner/Manager Tourism Industry (Burrito Day), four (4) year term

A motion was made by Mr. Raney, seconded by Mr. Cothorn, to approve the appointment of the above listed recommendations as members of the Advertising and Tourism Promotion (A&P) Commission. Motion carried with the following voting "yes": English, Raney, Brewer, Chalenburg, Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, and Cargile.

Item (8) on the agenda was for discussion regarding the Park Avenue/Cloverdale drainage project. There is some confusion as to the size of pipe that is being installed along Park Avenue and whether it is what was thought to have been approved by the Council. A motion was made by Mr. Raney and seconded by Mr. Cothorn to table this for further discussion when more information can be obtained. Mayor Osborne explained that more information will be requested and that a special meeting will be called once this information is received. Motion to table this discussion was approved with the following voting "yes": Raney, Brewer, Chalenburg, Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, and English.

Item (9) was for the discussion regarding properties located at 305 South College Street and 107 Rand Street. Code Enforcement Director Mike Cleveland explained that the property located at 305 South College Street has windows that are broken out and that persons are entering the property. He further explained that the Code Enforcement Department is currently working on having the property boarded up. Regarding the burned-out motel property located at 107 Rand Street, Mr. Cleveland noted that there had not been any additional progress made since the last report regarding this property. Mr. Gibson noted that it has been about two years since the property burned and that the owner has been given ample opportunity to correct the situation. He stated that it is his recommendation to allow Code Enforcement to work with the City Attorney's office in order to compel compliance and rectify the situation.

Item (10) on the agenda was for the consideration of an application from Community Taxi Cab for providing a taxicab service in the City of Searcy. Mr. Gibson explained that approval for providing a taxicab service in the City of Searcy must come from the City Council. He further noted that there is no specific resolution or ordinance required, just approval from the Council. The owner of the proposed taxicab service spoke to the Council regarding his services. A motion was made by Mr. Raney and seconded by Mr. Cothorn to approve the application from Community Taxi Cab for providing a taxicab service in the City of Searcy. Motion carried with the following voting "yes": Brewer, Chalenburg, Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, and Raney.

Item (11) was for discussion regarding the five-year plan update for the White County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan. Mr. Gibson explained that to enter into an

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agreement regarding the updated plan, it would require a resolution. Until a plan is developed there is nothing to consider. Mayor Osborne noted that the updated plan was in development and he would bring it forward when available. He further explained that the White County Office of Emergency Management had requested payment for the City of Searcy's portion of costs for development of this plan. An appropriation is included in the budget adjustment ordinance. A motion to table this item was made by Mr. Cothorn and seconded by Mr. English. Motion carried with the following voting "yes": Chalenburg, Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, and Brewer.

Item (12) was a resolution expressing the willingness of the City of Searcy, Arkansas to utilize Federal-aid Transportation Alternatives Program funds to develop or improve sidewalks to Searcy High School. Mr. Gibson read the resolution in full. A motion was made by Mr. Raney and seconded by Mr. Chalenburg to approve the resolution expressing the willingness of the City of Searcy, Arkansas to utilize Federal-aid Transportation Alternatives Program funds to develop or improve sidewalks to Searcy High School. Motion carried with the following voting "yes": Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, Brewer, and Chalenburg. **Resolution 2019-12**

Item (13) was a resolution expressing the willingness of the City of Searcy, Arkansas to utilize Federal-aid Transportation Alternatives Program funds to develop or improve sidewalks to Riverview School. Mr. Gibson read the resolution in full. Motion was made by Mr. Cothorn and seconded by Mrs. Arnett to pass the resolution. Motion carried with the following voting "yes": Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, Brewer, Chalenburg, and Cothorn. **Resolution 2019-13**

Item (14) was a resolution for authorization to enter into an administrative agreement with White River Planning and Development District, Inc. for providing administrative services on the grant funding from the Department of Parks and Tourism for playground equipment at the Searcy Event Center and Riverside Park. Mr. Gibson read the resolution in full. A motion was made by Mr. Brewer and seconded by Mrs. Arnett to approve the resolution for authorization to enter into an administrative agreement with White River Planning and Development District, Inc. for providing administrative services on the grant funding from the Department of Parks and Tourism for playground equipment at the Searcy Event Center and Riverside Park. Motion carried with the following voting "yes": Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, Brewer, Chalenburg, Cothorn, and Arnett. **Resolution 2019-14**

Item (15) was a resolution authorizing the execution of the lease of a city-owned building with Community Action Program of Central Arkansas (CAPCA). Mr. Gibson read the resolution in full. Motion was made by Mr. Brewer and seconded by Mrs. Arnett to pass the resolution. Motion carried with the following voting "yes": Cargile, English, Raney, Brewer, Chalenburg, Cothorn, Arnett, and Howell. **Resolution 2019-15**

Item (16) on the agenda was an ordinance providing for a moratorium on the construction, installation, or erection of manufactured homes within the city limits. A motion was made by Mr. Raney, seconded by Mr. Brewer, to suspend the rules and allow

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reading of the ordinance by title only. Motion carried with the following voting “yes”: English, Raney, Brewer, Chalenburg, Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, and Cargile. Mr. Gibson read the ordinance by title only. A motion was then made by Mr. Cothorn, seconded by Mr. Chalenburg, to adopt the ordinance. The ordinance passed with the following voting “yes”: Raney, Brewer, Chalenburg, Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, and English. Mr. Gibson then read the emergency clause of the ordinance. Motion was made by Mr. Raney, seconded by Mr. Chalenburg, to adopt the emergency clause, with the following voting “yes”: Brewer, Chalenburg, Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, and Raney.

**Ordinance 2019-13**

Item (17) on the agenda was an ordinance for the authorization to conduct business with certain businesses that are owned by employees of the City of Searcy or persons related to or affiliated with an employee of the City of Searcy. A motion was made by Mr. Chalenburg, seconded by Mr. Brewer, to suspend the rules and allow reading of the ordinance by title only. Motion carried with the following voting “yes”: Chalenburg, Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, and Brewer. Mr. Gibson read the ordinance by title only. A motion was then made by Mr. Raney, seconded by Mr. Brewer, to adopt the ordinance. The ordinance passed with the following voting “yes”: Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, Brewer, and Chalenburg. Mr. Gibson then read the emergency clause of the ordinance. Motion was made by Mr. Cothorn, seconded by Mrs. Arnett, to adopt the emergency clause, with the following voting “yes”: Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, Brewer, Chalenburg, and Cothorn.

**Ordinance 2019-14**

Item (18) on the agenda was an ordinance authorizing Central Arkansas Soccer Academy, Inc., d/b/a Whole Hog Café-Searcy, Arkansas to file for a private club permit with the Alcohol Beverage Control Division under the provisions of the City of Searcy private club permit ordinance and Arkansas law. A motion was made by Mr. Raney, seconded by Mr. Cothorn, to suspend the rules and allow reading of the ordinance by title only. Mayor Osborne asked for any discussion. Mr. Brewer stated that he thought that the ordinance should be read in its entirety in three different readings. Mr. Howell stated that he respectfully disagrees with three different readings. Mr. Raney noted that there is a motion and a second and therefore calls for a vote on the motion. Motion carried with a vote of six “yes” and two “no”. Motion carried with the following voting “yes”: Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, Cothorn, and Arnett. Voting “no” were Brewer and Chalenburg. Mr. Gibson read the ordinance by title only. A motion was then made by Mr. Raney, seconded by Mr. Cothorn, to adopt the ordinance. The ordinance was adopted with a vote of six “yes” and two “no”. The ordinance passed with the following voting “yes”: Cargile, English, Raney, Cothorn, Arnett and Howell. Voting “no” were Brewer and Chalenburg. Mr. Gibson then read the emergency clause of the ordinance. No motion was brought forward and the emergency clause fails for lack of a motion.

**Ordinance 2019-15**

Item (19) on the agenda was an ordinance authorizing McCain Dining Club, d/b/a Truth Table to file for a private club permit with the Alcohol Beverage Control Division under the provisions of the City of Searcy private club permit ordinance and Arkansas law. A

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motion was made by Mr. Raney, seconded by Mr. Cothorn, to suspend the rules and allow reading of the ordinance by title only. Mayor Osborne asked for any discussion. There was none. Motion carried with a vote of six “yes” and two “no”. Motion carried with the following voting “yes”: English, Raney, Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, and Cargile. Voting “no” were Brewer and Chalenburg. Mr. Gibson read the ordinance by title only. A motion was then made by Mr. Raney, seconded by Mr. Cargile, to adopt the ordinance. The ordinance was adopted with a vote of six “yes” and two “no”. The ordinance passed with the following voting “yes”: Raney, Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, and English. Voting “no” were Brewer and Chalenburg. Mr. Gibson then read the emergency clause of the ordinance. No motion was brought forward and the emergency clause fails for lack of a motion. **Ordinance 2019-16**

Item (20) on the agenda was an ordinance authorizing Chili’s-Searcy Club, Inc., d/b/a Chili’s to file for a private club permit with the Alcohol Beverage Control Division under the provisions of the City of Searcy private club permit ordinance and Arkansas law. A motion was made by Mr. Raney, seconded by Mr. Cargile, to table the consideration of the ordinance until the June 11, 2019 regular City Council meeting due to the management change as explained by Mr. Gibson during the public hearing that was held prior to this meeting. Motion carried with the following voting “yes”: Brewer, Chalenburg, Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, and Raney.

Item (21) on the agenda was an ordinance amending the Code of Ordinances of the City of Searcy, Arkansas, amending Chapter 17 concerning the application of certain assessments. A motion was made by Mr. Chalenburg, seconded by Mr. Brewer, to suspend the rules and allow reading of the ordinance by title only. Motion carried with the following voting “yes”: Chalenburg, Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, and Brewer. Mr. Gibson read the ordinance by title only. A motion was then made by Mr. Cothorn, seconded by Mr. Chalenburg, to adopt the ordinance. The ordinance passed with the following voting “yes”: Cothorn, Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, Brewer, and Chalenburg. Mr. Gibson then read the emergency clause of the ordinance. Motion was made by Mr. Raney, seconded by Mr. Chalenburg, to adopt the emergency clause, with the following voting “yes”: Arnett, Howell, Cargile, English, Raney, Brewer, Chalenburg, and Cothorn. **Ordinance 2019-17**
